

WORK PERMITS FOR ALL!

Fact Sheet



Biden has the administrative authority to grant work permits and protection from deportation to immigrants **without congressional approval.**

Administrative actions such as parole for at least 550,000 new migrants, recent TPS extensions, and DACA shows us that it well within the current administration's power to **extend work permits and protection from deportation to the 11 million long-term undocumented immigrants in the U.S.**

Biden has granted parole to 550,000 individuals from certain countries in the last 2 years

Parole is **essentially permission to be in the U.S.** and has been used for family members of U.S. citizens in the armed forces (Parole-In-Place), advanced parole for DACA recipients, and mass humanitarian parole for new migrants.

With parole, an individual can apply for a work permit for the duration of their parole. In certain cases, parole may also remove certain bars to adjust ones status to obtain residency.

Biden has the discretionary power to grant parole for urgent humanitarian reasons or for **significant public benefit.** Providing parole and work authorization to long-term undocumented immigrants presents a clear public benefit by addressing labor shortages, protecting immigrant workers and DREAMERs, and maintaining economic vitality.

Parole can be granted without congressional approval.

Parole, unlike comprehensive immigration policy change or registry, is an administrative action which does not require congressional approval.

Parole gives immigrants protection from deportation as we continue to fight for a clear pathway to citizenship for all 11 million undocumented immigrants.
